



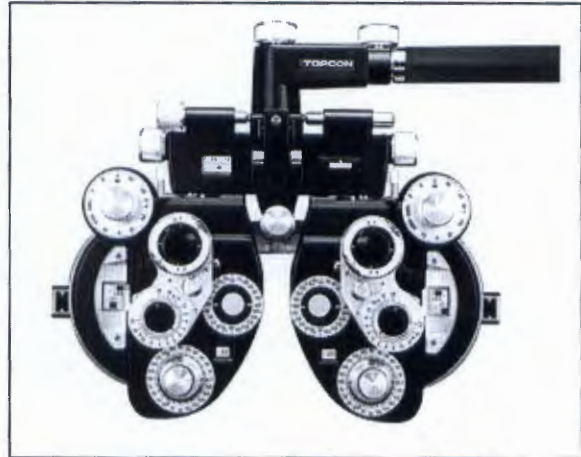
Acknowledgement of Non-covered Services - Refraction

Refraction

One service that many patients expect during their eye examination is a new prescription for eye glasses. To determine the correct prescription for glasses the technician places lenses of different strengths in front of your eye and assesses whether that lens improves or worsens the vision. The process of measuring the eye for glasses is called a **refraction**.

Many medical insurance plans, including Medicare, do not pay for a refraction.

Most vision insurance plans will pay for a refraction, but only if it is done by one of their providers – we may not be providers for your vision insurance plan. Because of these insurance company rules, in most cases you will be charged for a refraction if you are provided with a new prescription for glasses at your clinic visit today. Our fee for a refraction is \$50.00, due at the end of your clinic visit. If you want or need a new prescription for glasses, or have questions about refractions, please discuss this with your technician or doctor.
